POINT OF REENTRY AND TRANSITION (PORT) SERVICES

PORT works with Correctional Health Services (CHS) patients in the community. Patients are seen regardless of insurance status and medication can be provided at no cost through hospital pharmacies to those without coverage. PORT can accommodate walk-ins and same day visits. PORT can help you with:

- Connecting to primary care and other hospital based services (clinical and social)
- Connecting to health care and social service providers in the community

I NEED TO CLAIM MY COMMISSARY FUNDS & VALUABLE PROPERTY

If you're being released from Rikers Island or a borough facility, stop by the facility's cashier's office now and save yourself a trip back later.

If you forget, choose not to stop by, or are released from court, you can still pick up your property and claim remaining commissary funds.

IF YOU WERE AT RIKERS ISLAND

TO COLLECT YOUR PROPERTY:

You can pick up your valuable property immediately upon release or anytime in the next 30 days at the Samuel L. Perry Center on Rikers Island. The Perry Center is open 24/7. If you forget or choose not to stop by immediately, you can call 311 to make an appointment for pick up. You will need your book and case number or New York State identification number (NYSID).

TO RECEIVE YOUR COMMISSARY FUNDS:

You are encouraged to pick up your commissary funds upon release at the Rikers Island Central Cashier (RICC). If you choose not to immediately recover your funds, you have 120 days after your release to do so at RICC (open 24/7) or any other facility (see hours to right). Please bring your photo ID.

IF YOU WERE AT A BOROUGH FACILITY

You can pick up your property and retrieve commissary funds when the facility's cashier's office is open (hours below). Appointments aren't necessary, but please bring a photo ID.

If you can't make it to one of the cashier's offices, a friend or family member can pick up property and commissary funds for you. You must provide your friend or family member with a notarized letter giving them permission to pick up your property and funds, and have them follow the steps outlined above.
