EDUCATION SERVICES OPEN TO EVERYONE

THE JOHN JAY COLLEGE INSTITUTE FOR JUSTICE AND OPPORTUNITY

The John Jay College Institute for Justice and Opportunity offers education, career readiness, and reentry support tailored for justice-impacted individuals. Using a holistic, trauma-informed approach, the Institute helps participants access opportunity and build toward long-term success. Programs include:

- Tech 101–201: Teaches digital skills needed for school and work, including computer basics, job applications, internet use, and artificial intelligence. Personalized support and the NorthStar digital literacy assessment help guide progress.
- Collective Leadership Supervisor
 Training: A 21-hour virtual course that strengthens supervision skills for those managing justice-impacted employees.
 Open to NYC nonprofits and agencies, the course builds collaboration, confidence, and leadership within the reentry field.
- Student Success Initiative Program (SSIP): SSIP helps justice-impacted students from college entry through graduation with coaching, mentoring, and support. Services include academic advising, financial aid help, and a six-week College Exploration course to support informed decisions.
- Education Peer Mentors: Peer Mentors support new students in SSIP, Navigator, and GED programs. They offer guidance with reentry, school transitions, and academic support to encourage personal growth and college success through community engagement.

- Navigator Certificate in Human Services and Community Justice: A 17-week course taught by a John Jay professor and field experts for justice-impacted individuals pursuing careers in human services. Students gain hands-on experience, a certificate for Justice and Opportunity, and up to six CUNY college credits.
- Pathways to GED: Held weekdays from 9AM to 2PM in partnership with the NYC Department of Education's District 79. This in-person program supports justice-involved young adults ages 18–21 with individualized plans, leadership training, and career coaching to support academic success and post-GED planning.
- Career Pathways: Provides workshops and one-on-one coaching in resume writing, interview prep, and job exploration. Helps participants build confidence, identify strengths, and plan for work or further education.
- Unlocking Employment: A 90-minute online course for workforce providers working with people impacted by the legal system. Covers strength-based approaches, legal rights, reducing stigma, and effective employment strategies.

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
